

How do I apply for a Bursary?

For many students the biggest cost and barrier to attending College is the cost of transport. In 2024/25 we will, therefore, again be prioritising help with transport costs and our aim is to meet these costs in full for qualifying students wherever possible. For those applying for help from the Discretionary Bursary whose taxable household income is above the £20,000 threshold but below £30,000, the help provided is likely to be a proportion of the total transport cost.

For this reason we ask you to provide details of how you plan to travel to college.
